Frank Magaletta has been a hard working dedicated staff member of the White Plains Recreation and Parks Department for over 20 years. His responsibilities in the Department have involved almost all the programs that the Department offers. There is no assignment too big or too small that Frank does not perform in a cheerful and thoroughly professional manner. He is a 'go to' staff member for our Rec Trac system and complicated scheduling programs with hundreds of teams and thousands of players. He has been a leader, team player and a mentor to new staff members. He is greatly respected by his colleagues and clients.

Throughout his career in Recreation and Parks, Frank has worked diligently to create the best youth and adult sports programs and leagues. Our youth soccer program has expanded under his direction to include weekday and Sunday instructional classes, and a Special Needs programs. His youth instructional and camp golf programs are always over subscribed and the parents as well as the kids appreciate his diligence.

Frank oversees our summer day camp which provides a full season of recreational and educational programs for preschoolers to teens with over 1,400 participants in three camp sessions. During his tenure a teen camp was created that explores educational and fun venues throughout the region.

Our men's and women's softball program has 93 teams and recently we implemented what has become a very successful co-ed softball league with over 24 teams. Our softball leagues are considered the best in the County and attract residents and corporate teams from the area and are a selling point for corporations looking to relocate to White Plains.

The adult men and women's basketball program has also become one of the most competitive programs in the region. Four nights a week our leagues play hotly contested challenging games under the strict supervision of patched officials and recreation staff. Frank's fair but strict enforcement of the leagues rules and regulations is appreciated by most.

Frank has worked with our adult soccer teams to create safe and sustainable facilities in different areas of the City. Our adult soccer program has become a model for other communities seeking to accommodate changing demographic and recreational needs.

Frank is responsible for issuing and coordinating all field usage permits and overseeing the Field Marshal program to ensure that all of the City and School district's fields are being utilized by the appropriate permit holder.

As a recreational professional Frank always does his thorough due diligence and follow through and has earned the respect and appreciation of his colleagues, clients and many parents. His contribution to the recreational life of our residents has been tremendous.
