The seniors at the Fox Center in Mount Kisco are wonderfully enthusiastic, so it was no surprise when they agreed to try the Nintendo Wii system. Monday's became "Wii Mondays", and the program began to grow with bowling taking the lead. Seniors created their own Mii Avatars and the game kept track of their weekly scores. Fortunately, grant money eventually allowed us to purchase a Wii system. Monday afternoons at the Fox center are since filled with laughter, encouragement, and

sportsmanship. Our greatest generation can even show us how to properly play a video game!

The benefits of this program were too great to keep to ourselves. The WRAPS group of Senior Center professionals seemed like the perfect way to share it. A brief in-service was all it took to get things moving and in just a few months, Wii bowling took off at other senior centers. Senior Centers started getting together for lunch and bowling. This evolved into an organized Wii bowling league of five senior centers in Westchester. Bedford, Mount Kisco, Port Chester, Rye Brook and White Plains Seniors all had teams. As always, the bottom line was fun.

Although Wii bowling is the most popular program with our seniors, we have also had our own Winter Olympics, complete with fanfare, where we took part in ski jump, slalom and luge. The seniors also enjoy playing Wheel of Fortune; Price is Right, Big Brain Academy and most recently, Jeopardy. The seniors are looking forward to participating in the Summer Olympics- all via the Wii.

The Nintendo Wii changed me as a recreation professional. By stepping outside of my comfort zone, I discovered how much fun video games are. They allow us to enjoy community in familiar ways by playing together in person, or in totally new ways- as in the case of the virtual Wii bowling league. When physical limitations prevent participation in sports we once loved, Wii allows us to enjoy them again. Minds are challenged in new ways with games like Jeopardy and Big Brain Academy. Generational divides are crossed when grandma can play with her "plugged in" grandchild.

# **Compliance Extension for Existing Swimming Pools**

On May 18, 2012, the U.S. Justice Department announced that it is adopting a final rule extending compliance date for sections 242 and 1009 of the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Standards for Accessible Design, as they relate to the provision of accessible entry and exit to existing swimming pools, wading pools and spas. The provisions for existing pools of Title II and Title III entities will now take effect on January 31, 2013. For more details visit:
