Dear Fellow Professionals,

Since my last President's message we have been punctuated by disaster and crisis, from the Hurricane Sandy ravaged streets of New York and New Jersey to the horrendous tragedy that took the lives of 20 children and a half dozen adults at Newtown, Connecticut's Sandy Hook Elementary School.

After Hurricane Sandy, we watched as everyday people stepped up and provided any assistance they could to help out. Many of our community centers became temporary shelters for those affected by the hurricane. We provided a warm place to rest, a shoulder to lean on, games for children to play and outlets to recharge cell phones, iPods and iPads so our residents could stay connected with loved ones. Our parks staff worked tirelessly to put our vital parks and playgrounds back on line for our patrons by removing downed trees and debris in a timely and safe manner.

WRAPS members along with our family, friends, commercial vendors and co-workers, are responding to the tragedy in Newtown, Connecticut as one. The Executive Board has committed to matching a minimum of \$1000 in donations to help support the Newtown Recreation and Parks Department with a rebuilding of a playground/spray park/butterfly garden project in memory of those who lost their lives. No donation is too small; please consider supporting this effort so the residents of Newtown, especially the children, can realize a safe place to play, socialize and have fun.

A common denominator that has come from both these events is people going above and beyond. This is something that happens within WRAPS year in and year out, we might not notice or appreciate it at the time, but there is someone volunteering their time to further benefit our association. Just a few examples are: organizing the monthly luncheons, keeping track of our finances, taking minutes at board meetings, state and downstate conference committees, liaisons to the Health Department, keeping track of membership renewals, awards and scholarships, past president luncheon, fundraising, nominations and elections, grapevine, website, parks seminars, summer auditions, salary survey, and much more!

WRAPS is very fortunate to have so many wonderful people doing these types of things behind the scenes for us. Michael Jordan, who happens to be turning 50 as I write this, once said, "Some people want it to happen, some wish it could happen, others make it happen."


