Parks Corner

The WRAPS Parks Committee was busy this past winter, conducting three parks maintenance workshops. In January, a program on RECY-CLING IN THE PARKS was presented by Jim Hogan, Westchester County's Recycling Director. The program, which was hosted by the Scarsdale Recreation and Parks Department was attended by more than 30 park maintenance personnel as well as many park and recreation administrators.

POND MANAGEMENT AND D.E.C. REGULATIONS, HOW TO EFFECTIVELY MANAGE YOUR PONDS was the topic of our second program held at the Village of Hastings Recreation and Parks Department Community Center. Steven Ho of Aquatic Management and Terri Brocket of the NYSDEC discussed pond management and maintenance techniques along with present and future regulations concerning pond management activities. 18 persons attended this program.

Our March program was a trip to Yankee Stadium for a program on **BALLFIELD MAINTENANCE HELD ON March 31st after two** postponements due to inclement weather. 25 park and recreation managers and maintenance staff participated in this program. Bus transportation was provided courtesy of the Town of Cortlandt **Central Operations Department** Parks and Recreation Divisions. Yankee Stadium Superintendent Frank Alvohn and his ballfield maintenance staff provided an opportunity to see Yankee Stadium pre season field preparation in progress and answered countless questions regarding ballfield maintenance techniques.

Future activities of the Parks Committee include a survey of all municipal and county parks departments, the possible establishment of a PARKS EQUIPMENT SHAR-ING PROGRAM whereby parks departments in need of specific types of equipment could borrow this equipment from another department for periods of time as opposed to having to buy their own equipment. The Parks Committee hopes to have a report on the results of the survey ready in September which will be made available to all municipal and county recreation and parks departments. Further information regarding the PARK EQUIP-MENT SHARING PROGRAM should also be available at that time.

The Parks Committee is already working on a full slate of programs for 1992/1993 which will begin in September and run monthly thru March. Programs which we are looking into include: PARKS WINTERIZING, PARK **GROUNDS EQUIPMENT EXPO,** TRIP TO NEW YORK BOTAN-ICAL GARDENS, and an all day PARKS MAINTENANCE WORKSHOP. If anyone has comments regarding these programs or ideas and suggestions for other programs related to park maintenance and management, we would like to hear from you.
